Interim Prohibition Order: Mr Brett Luscombe

The Health and Community Services Complaints Commissioner (HCSCC), Dr Lynne Coulson Barr OAM, has issued an interim prohibition order against Mr Brett Luscombe, who was employed as a disability support worker.

The Office of the HCSCC commenced an investigation into Mr Luscombe's alleged conduct on 12 May 2026.

Mr Luscombe has been charged with offences against the *Criminal Law Consolidation Act 1935* (CLCA).

An offence against Part 3 of the CLCA is a prescribed offence for the purpose of section 56B(1)(ii) of the *Health and Community Services Complaints Act 2004* (SA) (the Act).

The Code of Conduct prescribed under section 56A of the Act and regulation 7 of the *Health and Community Services Complaints Regulations 2019* (SA) and set out at Schedule 2 of those Regulations (the Code), applies to Mr Luscombe, a health care worker, in the provision of health services.

Pursuant to section 56B(1)(b)(i) of the Act, Dr Coulson Barr has a reasonable belief that Mr Luscombe has breached regulation 15(1) of the Code.

This order is effective for a period of 12 weeks, and commenced 12.01am, 15 May 2026.

During that time Mr Luscombe is prohibited from:

- i) Providing health services, (however described).
- ii) Offering, advertising or otherwise promoting health services (including where those services may be provided by another person);
- iii) Holding himself out or otherwise promoting himself as a provider of health services; and
- iv) Providing advice in relation to the provision of health services (including where those services may be provided by another person).

This statement could not be published until the Court permitted Mr Luscombe to be publicly identified.

Dr Coulson Barr explained that she believes it is necessary to make this order to protect the health and safety of members of the public.
